## CEREMONY START TIME

### **Morning Ceremony start time 10am – arrive by 9am**

Applied Sciences & Social Practice, Health Practice, Humanities

### **Afternoon Ceremony start time 2pm – arrive by 1pm**

Creative Arts & Digital Information, Hospitality, Business & Service Industries, Trades, Engineering & Architectural Studies,

For guests, doors will open at 9am and 1pm, and all guests must be seated 20 minutes prior to the ceremony start time.

## GRADUATION ARRIVAL AND PROCESSION

**Graduates must arrive by 9am for the morning ceremony, and 1pm for the afternoon ceremony.**

If you're late, you will NOT be allowed to cross the stage.

## GRADUATION STUDENT ASSEMBLY

Graduates are to assemble at the Arena one hour before the ceremony starts. When you arrive, please follow the signs to the graduates assembly area and:

1. Find the row your department is in (A, B, C, D, E or F)
2. Find the name of your qualification.
3. Find your department sign and the sign on the ground that has your qualification name on it and stand behind it.
4. The marshals will then arrange you in alphabetical order, ready to proceed into the hall.
5. You need to stay in order to ensure you are ready to cross the stage when your name is called.

6. The Head Marshal will brief you on the details of the graduation ceremony. Then at a signal from the Head Marshal you will move in procession into the hall. Follow the directions of the marshals, who will direct you to your seat.

Don't worry, we will have plenty of signage and friendly staff onsite to ensure you know where to go, and end up in the right place. All you need to do is follow instructions.

## **CROSSING THE STAGE**

1. After the welcome and introductions, you will be called to receive your graduation parchment scroll. Marshals will direct you when to leave your seat.
2. File from your seat to the side of the stage and wait for your name to be checked.
3. When directed by the marshal, proceed across the stage.
4. You will shake hands with two people as you cross the stage.
5. If you are receiving a Bachelor's Degree, you will be ceremonially capped; you may then place your trowel on your head.
6. Move across to the second person on stage who will hand you a parchment scroll and shake hands with you.
7. Once you have received your parchment scroll, leave the stage down the central steps and return to your seat.

## **TICKETING / GUEST SEATING**

All graduates are entitled to up to four tickets free of charge for friends and whānau - you request these when you register for graduation.

Graduation guest tickets will be emailed to you around two weeks before graduation – by Monday 17 March. This email will come from Humanitix (not Ara). Tickets are general admission only.

If you would like to request extra tickets, you can also do this when you register for graduation. We try our best to accommodate these requests, but unfortunately this is not always possible as there is limited availability. Extra tickets will not be confirmed until Friday 28 February, after registration closes (this is so we can ensure all graduates receive their guaranteed tickets).

## **PHOTOGRAPHY & LIVESTREAMING**

If any of your friends or family are unable to attend your graduation in person, they can watch online as our graduation ceremonies are streamed live on the Ara website on the day.

Ara's graduation ceremonies are filmed for livestreaming and photographed. Footage and photos will be available publicly on our digital media and may also be used in Ara publications and promotional materials (digital and print). If you or any of your guests communicate by NZ Sign Language, we will have an interpreter at the ceremony.

## TIPS FOR ON THE DAY

1. Regalia - ensure you arrive at the venue already dressed and in your regalia.
2. Graduation ceremonies are lengthy so please make sure you're well hydrated and have eaten beforehand. If you feel unwell either before or during the ceremony, just let a staff member know and we can help.
3. Please leave personal items (e.g. handbags, mobile phones, flowers, etc) with your guests during the course of the procession and graduation ceremony.
4. Linton Photography are the official photographers for graduation. Studios will be set up at the venue so you can have portraits taken with family or friends. A limited number of session times are available to book, and sessions are also available on a first come, first served basis before and after your ceremony. Photographs will also be taken of every graduate as they are presented with their award on stage. ## REGALIA

As part of the formal graduation ceremony, you are required to wear official Ara regalia. If you are not wearing regalia, you will not be able to cross the stage.

GWC Regalia Hire own and maintain the regalia for Ara ceremonies and graduates are responsible for ordering their own regalia directly through them.

You must order your regalia by Thursday 20 March. Any orders placed from Friday 21 March will be charged a late fee of \$30.

You will receive a confirmation email after your regalia order is placed – if you do not receive this, please check directly with GWC Regalia to ensure that your order has been processed.

Some graduates also add traditional elements such as korowai or ta'ōvala. These may be worn over your academic gown. If you are wearing one of these elements, please request a lighter-weight gown when ordering your regalia.

## REGALIA ITEM HIRE COSTS

The hire cost of your regalia will depend on the qualification you are receiving:

## COLLECTING AND RETURNING REGALIA

You collect your regalia from GWC's premises on the UC Dovedale Campus, Wairarapa Building, Block ED15, Ilam. Parking is in Car Park 1, off Parkstone Ave or Solway Ave.

During graduation season, GWC's hours are extended, and you can collect your regalia anytime between 8am – 7pm on Thursday 27 March.

If you are unable to collect your regalia, a family member or friend can collect it on your behalf. However, you **MUST** give your nominated collection person your correct height measurement - and if you are eligible to wear a trencher - your head circumference (measured just above the ears).

Regalia must be returned, in good order, on Friday 28 March (the same day as graduation): by 3pm if you're attending the morning ceremony, or before 7pm for the afternoon ceremony.

Regalia cannot be returned at the venue and must be returned to GWC's premises on the UC Dovedale Campus (same location as collection).

A \$50 security hold will be applied to the card used to purchase the regalia hire with GWC. If you cannot provide this amount at check-in, you will not be able to collect your regalia. This security hold cannot be paid in cash. The security hold will show as a pending transaction and will automatically 'drop off' after 7 days, once it's been confirmed that the regalia was returned undamaged within the above timeframe.

After 28 March, the GWC Regalia Hire opening hours go back to standard hours which are Tuesdays and Thursdays 9.30am – 2.30pm.

### **Penalties for non-return of regalia**

A family member or friend can return regalia on your behalf. Please be aware if regalia is not returned, or is damaged, you will be charged at replacement cost which is:

Gown	\$650
Hood	\$180
Trencher Hat	\$225
Scarf	\$100

### **REGALIA REFUND POLICY**

If you notify Ara that you are withdrawing from your Graduation ceremony by Thursday 27 March, you will receive a full refund of your regalia hire costs minus a \$10 administration fee. However, in the event you do not collect your regalia and do not let us know in advance, there are no refunds.

If you are prevented from attending graduation at the last minute due to illness or travel disruption, you can hire your regalia for photos or a private ceremony at another time.

### **REGALIA ITEMS**

#### **Gown**

A black, Cambridge-style gown is worn under the Ara graduation scarf or hood. The sleeves on the Cambridge gown have two openings:

- graduates for a certificate, diploma or degree that have no previous degree use the lower opening
- any graduate with a previous degree, new degree, graduate certificate, graduate diploma, postgraduate or Masters use the higher opening

#### **Diploma and certificate scarf**

A diploma scarf (dark teal) is worn by graduates receiving diplomas or graduate diplomas and a certificate scarf (light teal) is worn by graduates receiving certificates or graduate certificates.

#### **Degree hood**

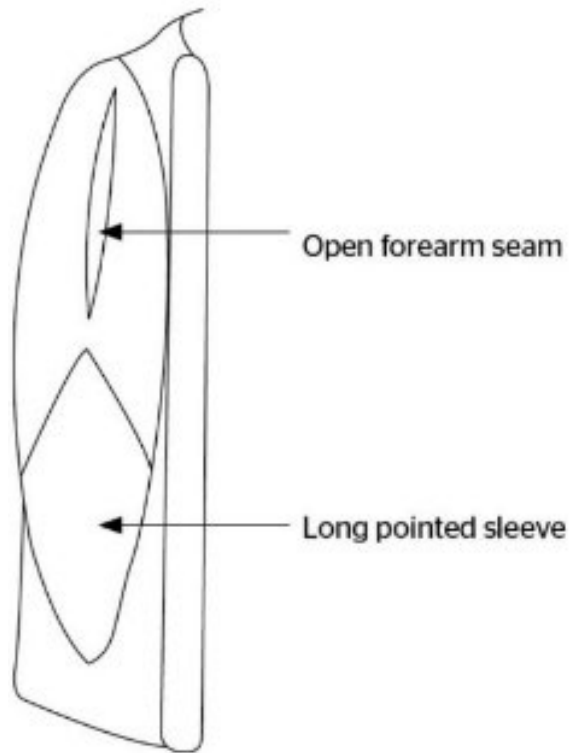
The degree hood incorporates an Ara diploma scarf. The hood is worn with the scarf sitting on the shoulders and the hood hanging down the wearer's back.

#### **Hood lining colours**

Each degree hood lining is a different colour denoting the degree being conferred.



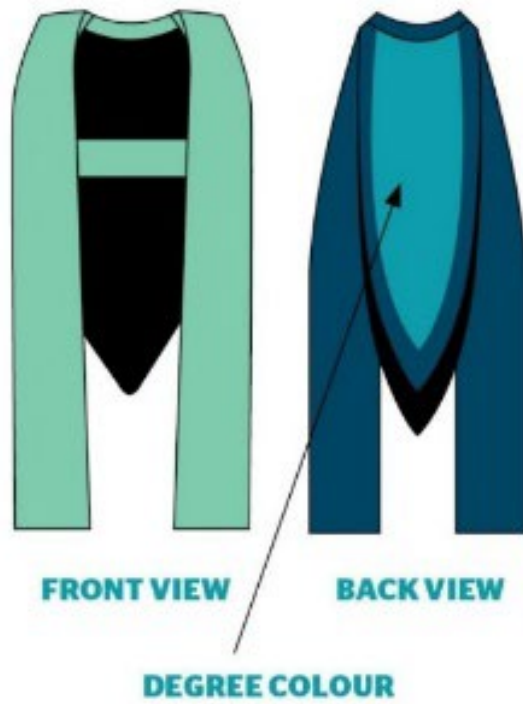
